

THE FERTILITY PRESERVATION PROGRAM

On August 17, 2021, the Division of Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility (REI) at the Department of OBS/GYN at AUBMC, launched the Fertility Preservation Program at the Haifa Idriss Fertility Unit under the directorship of Dr. Ghina Ghazeeri.

The program will be offering various methods for preserving fertility, for both female and male patients who electively wish to preserve their fertility with the aim of achieving ones' biological progeny at a later stage of life. Candidates for fertility preservation include cancer patients prior to chemotherapy and/or radiotherapy, patients with autoimmune and/or genetic disease with predisposition for decreased gamete reserve, and women who opt to delay childbearing for social and/or personal reasons.

This is a collaboration with the Naef K. Basile Cancer Institute, Children's Cancer Institute, and the Department of Psychiatry. Our multidisciplinary team includes reproductive endocrinology specialists, psychiatrists, clinical psychologists, urologists and oncology nurses.



It has been a while since we last issued our newsletter. We have been working hard as faculty and medical and paramedical staff to ensure the smooth running of the department in these difficult times to continue offering the same level of service that we have always strived to provide. Highlighted in this issue are news about the launching of the Fertility Preservation Program at the Haifa Idriss Fertility Unit, about departing residents, and the upcoming departmental symposium on November 13, 2021. 
OUR GRADUATES ARE NOW ELIGIBLE FOR AMERICAN BOARD CERTIFICATION

The American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology (ABOG) announced on March 4, 2021 that it received approval from the American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) to pursue implementation of an Alternate Pathway to achieve OBS/GYN Specialty Certification for physicians who have completed training in OBS/GYN residency programs accredited by organizations other than the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME), and who have achieved OBS/GYN certification in another country or by another certification organization. The Alternate Pathway to OBS/GYN certification applies to graduates from OBS/GYN residency programs that are accredited by the ACGME-International with Advanced Specialty Accreditation. As such, our graduates since July 1, 2015, our initial date of ACGME-I accreditation, are eligible to pursue this for possible certification and can access the following website for more details: https://www.abog.org/specialty-certification/alternate-pathway-to-certification.

WISH PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

The Women's Integrated Sexual Health (WISH) Program at the Women's Health Center (WHC) recently conducted a 2-day course on sexual health for health care providers sponsored by an unrestricted grant. It is collaborating with AUB wellness on a series of sexual health awareness webinars 2021-2022. The program also received a grant from UNFPA for a health promotion project covering menstrual hygiene, sexually transmitted infections, sexuality and sexual health, and mental health following the Beirut blast and the project was concluded in April 2021.

Another project on training on menstarual health hygiene and sexual health matters and that is expected to span over 3 months this fall was just funded.



OBGYN INTEREST GROUP: PASSION TO OBS/GYN

The OBGYN Interest Group (OGIG) is a student-led initiative aiming to bring together, inform, and orient AUBMC medical students who share a passion for OBS/GYN, while fostering a solid understanding and appreciation of the field. Since its foundation in November 2020, the OGIG now comprises more than 100 student members and volunteers, creating possibly the first and largest student interest group at AUB - Faculty of Medicine. This large community of students is divided into various teams with curated roles and objectives.

The activities led by OGIG include hosting journal clubs, guest lecturers, and mentoring talks and sharing monthly newsletters, initiating healthcare advocacy and education campaigns, as well as volunteering and coordinating free, bi-monthly, student-run Women's Health Clinics at the OBS/GYN outpatient clinics. Through the previous four such clinics conducted by OGIG, more than 40 patients have received comprehensive care including clinical examinations and assessments, screening tests, imaging, and laboratory studies at nil or significantly reduced prices. Those clinics are run under the supervision of OBS/GYN attending physicians and residents.

Did you know?

- AUB ranked as the number two university in the Arab world and number 242 worldwide in 2021.
- AUB campus spans over an area of 246,453 square meters.
- The Syrian Protestant College, which was renamed AUB in 1920, opened with its first class of 16 students on December 3, 1866. The school of medicine followed one year later in 1867.
- The cornerstone of College Hall, the first building on the present campus in Ras Beirut, was laid on December 7, 1871.
- In 1890, AUB awarded its first honorary doctorates to Yaqub Sarruf and Faris Nimr, recognizing their pioneering work in journalism.
- In 1921, AUB admitted, for the first-time, women as graduate students in the schools of medicine, pharmacy, and dentistry.
- In December 1922, May Ziadeh became the first woman to lecture at AUB.
- In 1933, Edma Abu-Chedid, became the first woman to receive a medical doctorate from the institution.
- In 1966, AUB awarded its first PhD in Arabic history.
- Estimated at 70,000 living alumni, AUB graduates reside in approximately 115 countries worldwide.
- · All presidents of the university have been in residence at Marquand House, which was completed in 1879.
- According to US Attorney General Robert Kennedy, "More world leaders have been educated at 'AUB' than any other institution I can think of – even Harvard."
- There were more graduates of AUB (19 delegates) than from any other institution present at the signing of the UN Charter on June 26. Five of them even signed the UN Charter.
