What is multiple sclerosis (MS)?

MS is a chronic autoimmune disease that affects the brain and spinal cord. In MS, the immune system reacts against components in the nervous system causing disabilities (movement, strength, vision, balance, sensation, etc.) that can be reversible or irreversible.

Who gets MS?

Most MS patients are diagnosed with MS between the ages of 20-40. But the disease can also affect younger and older people. The progress, severity, and specific symptoms of MS are unpredictable and vary from one person to another.

How is MS treated?

The treatment of MS is multidisciplinary and involves physicians, nurses, psychologists, on-site pharmacists, and physical therapists. Today, new treatments and advances in research are giving hope to people affected by the disease.
